Priority 1: CREATE AN ECONOMICALLY VIABLE MODEL FOR FRENCH FARMING	62
• Implement effective risk control	62
– Maintain public support as a safety net, guaranteeing a system of minimum prices	
– Expand the use of futures and options	
– Allow farmers to set aside provisions	
– Favour the development of contractual relationships as a reliable framework for commitments concerning quantities, prices and quality	
• Set up a framework for more balanced relationships between upstream (farmers) and downstream industries (large-scale retailers and agrifood industries)	65
– Encourage inter-professional associations to play a more active role	
– Reinforce monitoring and repression of anti-competitive practices in large-scale retailing	
• Create conditions for more fair international competition	67
– Promote harmonization of social and environmental standards	
– Ensure that efforts in favour of the least developed countries are more equally shared	
– Obtain WTO condemnation of marketing loans and countercyclical payments to US farmers (or, in case of failure, adopt a similar policy in the EU)	
• Overhaul the promotion and supervision of quality	68
– Reduce the number of labels attesting the quality of products to one or two that are readily recognized by consumers	



– Consider the creation of an agency for the promotion of French agricultural products
